

Section 24A (4) Gaming Machine Act Special Club License condition 3 – reference to distribution of funds among community, sporting and recreational groups for the period 2013 - 2014

Introduction

Club One is the holder of Special Club Licence 51500003.

The Licence has the authorization to:

“possess approved gaming machines and to operate them on premises in respect of which someone else holds a gaming machine licence as agent of the holder of the gaming machine licence in accordance with the Gaming Machines Act, 1992 and the conditions of the licence.”

Among the conditions is the following:

“The licence is subject to the following conditions imposed by section 24A(4) of the Gaming Machines Act, 1992:

3. A condition requiring the holder of the licence to provide a report to the Minister, no later than 30 September in each year, on the conduct of its financial affairs during the financial year ending on the previous 30 June, including reference to distribution of funds among community, sporting and recreational groups”

The distribution of funds among community, sporting and recreational groups.

Summary:

In 2013 -2014 Club One paid 87% of after company tax income to community, sporting and recreational clubs and groups.

It distributed \$868,546.84 to more than 100 community, sporting and recreational clubs and groups.

It provided capital support, in the form of paying interest on loans for the purchase of GMEs at the pre deregulated price of \$50,000 plus GST, of \$454,473.93

Direct:

Club One distributes funds directly by way of two sponsorship programs.

1. The small sponsorships grants – managed by the Board through the Executive Officer, determined monthly, up to \$500 per application. In August the Board raised the amount from \$3,000 per month to \$4,000 per month and amended the annual budget 2013-2014 to be **\$46,000** plus GST.

- a. Indirect – return from vesting

Club One enters into an arrangement with some Clubs when it purchases Gaming Machine Entitlements (GME) termed vesting.

Vesting is a permanent arrangement whereby Club One pays an annual fee to the Club in return for the GME.

The intent of vesting is to provide permanent and better return to a Club than the return they could get from investing the proceeds of the sale of a GME.

Presently Club One has 118 GMEs subject to such arrangements. During 2013 - 2014 financial year Club One made vesting payments of **\$791,783.66**

Club One also declined to apply the vesting formula that has been agreed as many Clubs would lose income.

As Club One raises this money annually to meet this cost, Club One is contributing all the payment to the industry.

Club One also makes a payment to the Licensed Clubs Association to compensate it for the loss in membership fee revenue because Club One holds GMEs previously in Clubs. In 2013-2014 Club One paid **\$7,936.36**.

Additionally Club One makes occasional direct sponsorship of events and projects it deems to be of merit. In 2012 – 2013 this amounted to **\$22,736.82**

Club One provided support to clubs for projects. In this reporting period the \$100,000 lent in 2012 -2013 as an Interest Free Loan has remained in place with expectations a repayment will commence in October 2014.
