Introduction

Club One is the holder of Special Club Licence 51500003.

The Licence has the authorization to:

“possess approved gaming machines and to operate them on premises in respect of which someone else holds a gaming machine licence as agent of the holder of the gaming machine licence in accordance with the Gaming Machines Act, 1992 and the conditions of the licence.”

Among the conditions is the following:

“The licence is subject to the following conditions imposed by section 24A(4) of the Gaming Machines Act, 1992:

3. A condition requiring the holder of the licence to provide a report to the Minister, no later than 30 September in each year, on the conduct of its financial affairs during the financial year ending on the previous 30 June, including reference to distribution of funds among community, sporting and recreational groups”

The distribution of funds among community, sporting and recreational groups.

Summary:

In 2015 -2016 Club One paid **\$ 806,017.31** of after company tax income to Not for Profit community, sporting and recreational clubs and groups.

It distributed **\$42,047** to more than 80 Not for Profit community, sporting and recreational clubs and groups.

Club One makes one off sponsorships and grants for events and projects to Clubs on the basis of merit. In 2015 -16 this was **\$12,352.73**

It provided additional capital support for Not for Profit Clubs, in the form of paying interest on loans for the purchase of Gaming Machine Entitlements (GMEs) at the pre deregulated price of \$50,000 plus GST, of **\$423,520.80**

Sponsorships

Club One distributes funds directly by way of a sponsorship program. These small sponsorships grants are managed by the Board through the Executive Officer, determined monthly, up to \$500 per application.

Vesting

Club One has entered into an arrangement with some Not for Profit Clubs whereby it purchases Gaming Machine Entitlements (GME) termed Vesting.

Vesting is a permanent arrangement whereby Club One pays an annual fee to the Vesting Not for Profit Club in return for the permanent allocation of their GMEs to Club One.

The intent of vesting is to provide a permanent and better return to a Not for Profit Club than the return they could get from investing the proceeds of the sale of a GME.

Presently Club One has 118 GMEs subject to such arrangements. During 2015 - 2016 financial year Club One made vesting payments to Not for Profit Clubs of **\$751,617**
